It's that time again — time for the 2024 Southern California Spring Ring! Our festival this year will once again be in beautiful Oceanside, in San Diego County, at St. Thomas More Catholic Church. Our site hosts, **Douglas Lynn** and the **Tower Bells**, are looking forward to seeing all of you there. Our clinician this year is Southern California's own **Elizabeth Mays Loebig**.

This year, we are offering **Bronze Vision** as well as massed ringing, so you have two options to choose from:

- OPTION 1 Bronze Vision and Massed Ringing: Are you a handbell addict? Do you like to be challenged? If you answered YES to either of these questions, then Bronze Vision is for YOU! This option features four hours of intense ringing something all you handbell addicts will love! Beth will work to bring out all the music that's in these "meaty" pieces and in YOU, all the while keeping it lively and fun for everyone. The Bronze Vision group will present two pieces at the Saturday afternoon concert. Expect to work hard, but expect to go home with a BIG SMILE on your face! Rehearsals are Friday night 7:00-9:00 and Saturday morning 8:00-10:00. Massed ringing begins at 11:00 on Saturday morning. Concert is at 5:30. The concert is free and open to the public. (FWO)
- **OPTION 2 Massed Ringing only:** Just what it says on the tin. Massed ringing on Saturday, beginning at 11:00 AM. Concert is at 5:30. The concert is free and open to the public. (FWO)

Come as a choir or an individual ringer bringing your own bells and music. If any groups or individual ringers cannot bring their own bells, please contact me at SoCal.Area12@HandbellMusicians.org and I will see what I can do to help. If desired, individual ringers may be added to incomplete groups.

Our hosts will again have a sandwich lunch available for Spring Ring attendees for a small fee added to registration. If you choose not to take advantage of this opportunity, there is plenty of space on campus to eat if you bring your own lunch, or there are a few restaurants not far from the church. If you choose to go to a restaurant, we recommend googling one and placing your order in advance since we have only 30 minutes for lunch!

Your registration will be confirmed by email shortly after it is received. Walk-in registrants are welcome at the door (at full registration price, plus a \$5 surcharge), as long as we have room. Early registration helps our planning, so please register as soon as possible! All groups, no matter their skill level, are encouraged to consider playing a solo piece during the concert. However, there will be a limit of THREE (3) solo pieces this year (first come, first served!). The concert will last about 90 minutes.

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REPERTOIRE

Also: we are looking for percussionists for one of the Bronze Vision pieces and one of the massed ringing pieces. If one or more of your ringers or friends can do it, please let us know!

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MORE DETAILS

Table rental: Tables will be available to rent for \$1.50/foot until we "sell out". We recommend that choirs bring their own. Foam and covers will NOT be available; choirs MUST bring their own.

Music exchange: There will be a table where directors may lay out music they no longer use. Feel free to help yourself from this display; it is a free exchange.

Handbell store: We have not had a handbell store at this event for a few years now. I can contact handbell vendors and ask them to send a box of material to sell, but I cannot staff the table myself. If someone (or several someones) would be willing to staff the table before the event and during our breaks, Area 12 will pay for their lunch at the event. Free-will Offering: An offering will be taken at the concert. Please invite friends & family to the concert – <u>we'd like a big audience!</u>

Snacks and things: During the breaks, there will be an opportunity to munch on goodies. We need your help with this, so please bring some snacks to share. We will provide coffee, tea, and water. This will also be a good time to shop at the handbell store (if we have one), enjoy each other's company, and ask questions.

ABOUT OUR CLINICIAN

At eight years of age, **Elizabeth Mays Loebig** picked up a C7 behind her mother's back one afternoon at the church handbell rehearsal. Upon discovery of her daughter's transgression, director Linda immediately assigned Beth said C7 as a member of the choir. Over thirty years later, Beth graduated from Azusa Pacific University with Master's degrees in both Handbell Performance and Conducting. She is now an accomplished soloist, music teacher, and conductor. Her graduate recital, *The History of Handbells*, featured 13 pieces narrating the rich traditions of English handbells as well as moving the art forward into the next generation. She has earned the first Master of Music degree in Performance: Handbells in the United States. Beth is now continuing her studies at Claremont Graduate University, working on Ph.D. in Musicology. She is a founding member of the professional handbell ensemble Timbré and serves as Education Director for Area 12 of the Handbell Musicians of America. Her debut solo handbell album, *Pure Imagination*, is currently in progress.

If you wish to use a tablet computer to hold your music in place of standard paper copies on a music stand or in a binder, you must contact the publisher of each piece of music to first obtain permission to convert a purchased piece of music to the format required for the tablet you are using. Copies of the written permission received from publishers must be presented on request from the event organizer or Handbell Musicians of America staff. Permission from a publisher for one piece does not imply permission for other pieces from the same publisher. The title of each piece used in this format must be included in the written permission received. Attendees should also have legally purchased copies of all music with them for verification.

Finally, membership in the Guild is strongly encouraged. A director or church/school can join for an annual fee of \$95 for their entire choir (or a monthly fee of \$9). If individual choir members want to receive access to online resources, they can join for a sub-membership of \$10/year. There are also membership options for full-time students and retired handbell musicians! Membership in Handbell Musicians of America gives you a monthly copy of Overtones magazine, discount prices for area and national events, access to mentoring programs, and more!
